All exhibits remain the responsibility of the exhibitor. No responsibility will be assumed by the Association for the care of any items entered except that display areas will be sectioned off and signposted minimally for safety & viewing purposes. Judging will take place at specified times unless unforeseen circumstances arise. All entries must be paid for before displaying and criteria for display should be met as best as possible. The judges' decision will be final and try not to question the results. Please try to be at the festival to accept prizes if at all possible but, if not, leave your postal details with Jo or Barb.

Each category has age groups and sections. See the particular category/ies for which you want to enter. **Every entry costs 50c for 12 years and under, \$1 per open entry and needs to be paid on registering your entry/ies.** The idea is to enjoy the experience so the entry requirements are mainly to reduce confusion and/or disappointment. All perishable entries that is, food items only, need to be dropped to Builyan Hall no later than 10:00 am on the Festival day. Non-perishable entries must be dropped off on Friday between 3 and 5 pm at the Builyan Community hall. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you need to make alternative drop off times. It really helps if photos and craft items can be delivered or picked up the day before so that displays can be set up and judging can commence on time. No access to the competition area will be allowed whilst judging is taking place. The announcement and presentation of awards will be made after the Super Cent Sale concludes, you may collect your entries then.

Class 6A. One stem rose, any colour/variety.

Class 6D. One stem double gerbera, any colour/variety.

Class 6E. Three gerbera stems, any colour/variety

Class 6F. A recycled container of mixed colours blossoms.

Want to show off your great chooks? Well here is the chance. We country folk have an embedded history in raising our own fowl and producing our own home-grown (un-hormonified) eggs. Now, give your favourite or favourites a good bath (yes, a bath), preen them, feed them up and teach them to be calm while you show them off for judging. You will need a good cage per entry (2 birds can be presented in one cage as long as you have separate entry forms. You will need to bring your own water and feed. There will be a covered area for presentation but not necessarily enclosed.
